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# Tony Criswell, Living a Life of Love

Tony was a 1983 graduate of Frankfort High School; he attended Purdue University and later graduated from Ball State in 1991. Tony worked at Ivy Tech as the Assistant Director of Disability Support Services serving primarily students with disabilities following his employment at Abilities Services in Frankfort. Tony had served as an ADA Consultant for Clinton County and on the Indiana Human Right Committee of Tippecanoe County.

Tony shared love with his students, parents, brothers, and sister and their families while living a faithful covenant made with his wife, Cathy. Oliver, Tony's dog, was a loyal companion.

Tony's passion was to assist people with disabilities achieve their educational goals. He was a valued member of the lvy Tech

June 25, 1965 -January 2, 2013 team who made it possible for many students with disabilities to earn degrees and have fulfilling jobs.

# An Advocate for Accessibility

"I am blessed to have many memories of Tony and his service to others. One of many that comes to mind is how Tony advocated for increased recreation opportunities for students with limited mobility issues.

"[Tony] researched and ultimately was responsible for the Lafavette Campus enhancing our Wellness Center by adding an Uppertone machine.

"This machine was designed by a C4-C5 quadriplegic. It allows people with C4-C5 and below quadriplegia (tetraplegia) due to spinal cord injury to do all the necessary upper body exercises necessary for rehabilitation and maintenance, without any assistance.

"Indeed, all the adjustments, including resistance, can be made without hand grip strength, cuffs, or assistance.

"All students have now benefited from Tonv's work, whether they have used this machine or simply exercised by someone using this machine." Dr. Laws
